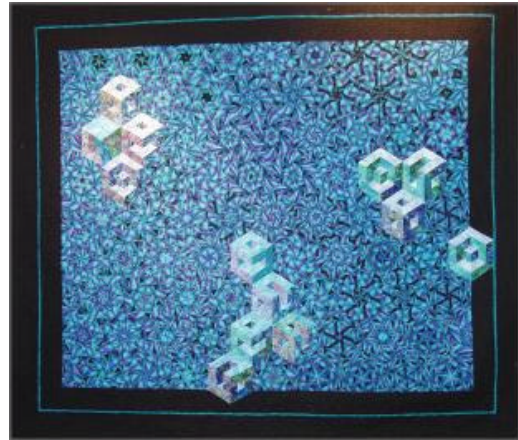


218DA: Cubes, Hollow and Otherwise

A flat quilt yet it has dimension. Unlike the baby blocks, these cubes have an inside that can be seen. They are hollow cubes, and cubes that have been sliced open in all directions. Easy to do yet they look difficult. These cubes are the same size and shape as the One Block Wonders.

Fabric - An assortment of light, medium and dark fabrics. Fat quarters are enough, and this is a good way to use up scraps from your. They don't have to match; they don't have to be of one color theme, this is a class in value. It is fun to mix different colors in one quilt. Bring along a piece of fabric from a One Block Wonder and use that too, especially if you are planning to add it to the One Block Wonder Hexagon quilt.



Supplies:

- Rotary cutting equipment – mat, straight rulers, rotary cutter.
- 60 degree ruler - preferably a Clearview Triangle. This is a must – you cannot use the 60 degree line on a regular ruler.
- Design wall so that you can see the dimension of your cubes from a distance and to admire them and everyone else's.
- Sewing machine and basic sewing supplies and irons.
