

309DM: Creative Printmaking Supply List

I have written two books that include some Creative Printmaking Techniques, many of which will be covered in this class. SUPPLIES:

FABRIC: Bring at least **20 pieces** of a fine thread count **white** cotton **torn** into 8" x 10" pieces. **Do not pre-wash the fabric and do not cut the fabric with a rotary cutter.** Remove all of the threads on the edges of the fabric before bringing it to class. Also iron the fabric very well with a steam iron before class. In addition, bring about **10 pieces** of **black** or dark colored fabric pieces also **torn** into 8" x 10" squares.

PAINT:

- ❑ **Jacquard's Neopaque:** Bring at least three colors---a dark, medium and light color. You can bring squeeze bottles or jars.
- ❑ **Jacquard's Lumiere:** Bring at least two colors in either jars or squeeze bottles.
- ❑ **Jacquard's Textile Paint:** Bring at least three colors---a dark, medium and a light color. You can bring squeeze bottles or jars.
- ❑ **Sherrill's Sorbets:** Bring at least two colors in either jars or squeeze bottles.
- ❑ If you don't have this paint, please bring comparable paint---acrylic paint, metallic paint, transparent textile paint, or other paint for printmaking.

MISCELLANEOUS SUPPLIES:

- ❑ **Freezer paper**---to place on your work area and to use for **monoprints**. Cut the freezer paper into 12"x12" pieces. Bring about 20 pieces. Re-roll the paper in the opposite direction to flatten it.
- ❑ **Styrofoam plate, butcher tray, or take out lids.**
- ❑ **Sharp scissors**
- ❑ **Rubber stamps**---I will provide "**Impress Me**" rubberstamps for class use. I will also bring **rollagraphs** for class use.
- ❑ **String**---bring different thicknesses of string for gluing.

- ❑ **Foam core board**---approximately 3"x3"---they can be smaller or **larger**---bring several
- ❑ **Waterproof glue**
- ❑ **Ballpoint pen**
- ❑ **Square of heavy corrugated cardboard or foam core board**---about 4" x 8"
- ❑ **Heavy rubber bands**
- ❑ **Plastic** to cover your work surface
- ❑ **Paper towels**---have about 20
- ❑ **Water containers**---two large water containers about the size of a large Cool Whip container. The containers should be flat and deep.
- ❑ **Takeout knife**
- ❑ **Old shirt or apron** to protect your clothing
- ❑ **Notebook and pen** to take notes in class
- ❑ **Battery operated toothbrush or old regular toothbrush**---to clean your hands, the rubberstamps, and to do creative techniques.
- ❑ **Camera**---either digital or regular camera

SPONGE---This is a very important piece of equipment. Most of the techniques I do on my projects involve a sponge. The sponge never hardens. Cut the sponge into 1 ½" squares with a few smaller sizes and a few larger sizes. The sponge is deep yellow orange. You can usually find the sponge in the paint and wallpaper departments of home improvement stores.
