

T18A: Crazy Lonely Star

Class Length: Half Day - Morning

Skill Level: All



Learn the basics of crazy piecing while making a Lone Star like you've never seen before. A good way to use up your scraps! Class project is a 36" square wall hanging.

Fabric Supply List:

Foundation Fabric: One yard of featherweight sew-in interfacing (non-fusible kind).

Scrap Fabrics: 12-18 fabric scraps (prints) **in one color.** By fabric scraps I really mean scraps—a palm-sized scrap would be a big piece. It will be easier for you to learn the piecing technique with smaller pieces such as half-palm size. The more fabric prints/scraps you can bring in one color the better your CLS will look. If you are a fast sewer you can bring a second set of scraps in a second color.

Background Fabric: In class you should get 1 diamond sewn (you will need 8). When you complete the other 7 you will need background fabric to square out the quilt. The background fabric will be cut into setting squares and triangles. You do not need to bring the background fabric with you but you will eventually need :

1 ½ yards of background fabric.

I would suggest a solid, a splotchy solid (such as Moda Marbles) or a watercolor batik solid as good background fabrics.

Tools:

Basic sewing supplies for machine sewing

Rotary cutter, matt and acrylic ruler

Neutral thread

Scissors and pins
