

## I RECOMMEND YOU CHOOSE THE SMALLER PROJECT FOR CLASS

### THE FLIP FLOP BLOCK

A one piece, 6.125 (5 5/8") curved, acrylic template  
to make an accurate, tessellation block for any size quilt

#### SUPPLY LIST

Rotary cutter (28mm)  
Large cutting mat  
Thread to match  
Batting  
Backing  
Fabric Yardage

#### IMPORTANT TIP

LARGE SIZE 45mm ROTARY CUTTERS DO NOT  
WORK WELL AROUND THIS CURVED TEMPLATE.

Start with a fresh blade in your 28mm cutter.

This is curved piecing. It is different from  
what we are used to with traditional piecing.

But, the good news is, it is very forgiving and  
not at all difficult once you get going. Do a  
practice run by putting 4 blocks together.

It will work, I promise you.

DO NOT BE AFRAID.

# of Blocks		For Top	Borders	Bindings	Totals
35	Baby quilt	1 1/2 yds	1 1/2 yds	1yd	4 yds
45	Lap quilt	2 yds	3 yds	2 yds	7 yds
192	Queen size	8 yds	3 yds	2yds	13 yds

Baby quilt, 5 x 7 blocks = 35 needed - Finished w/one border= 34" x 46"

Lap quilt, 5 x 9 blocks = 45 needed - Finished w/two borders=41" x 62"

Queen, 12 x 16 blocks = 192 needed - Finished w/one border=78" x 100"

**\*\*All of the finished measurements are dependent on your border choice\*\***

Depending on how many colors you choose for your quilt, here's what you can  
cut from your yardage:

1 yd (35") = 24 blocks  
1/2 yd (17 1/2") = 12 blocks  
1/4 yd (8 1/2") = 6 blocks

Baby Quilt (35 blocks) - 1/4 yds of 7-9 colors

Lap Quilt (45 blocks) - 1/4 yds of 10-12 colors

Queen Size (192 blocks)-1/4yds of 12-15 colors

Using the 1/4 yard = 6 blocks formula, multiply that times the colors you  
choose for your quilt.      Prestart:      Wash, dry and iron your fabrics.
